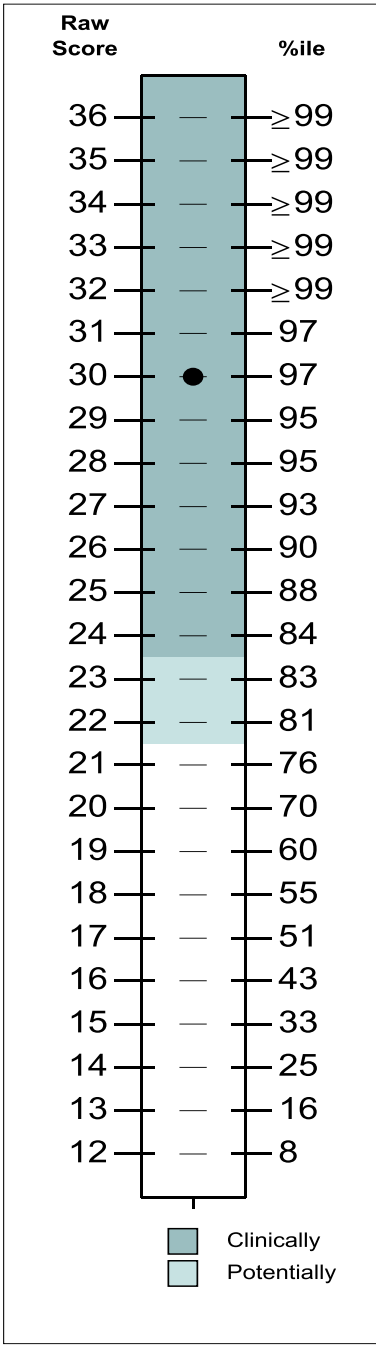

Overview

Sample Client’s parent completed the Behavior Rating Inventory of Executive Function®, Second Edition (BRIEF®2) Screening Parent Form, a 12-item questionnaire designed to detect problems with self-regulation, on 06/16/2015. There are no missing item responses in the protocol.

Summary and Recommendations

Sample’s Executive Function Screening raw score of 30 was higher than 97% of other male’s his age, indicating that there is a greater likelihood that this score is outside of normative expectations. Scores at this level are considered Clinically Elevated.

Students with clinically elevated scores are at substantially increased risk for self-regulatory difficulties. Referral for further evaluation, including completing the full BRIEF2 rating scale, is clearly warranted.
