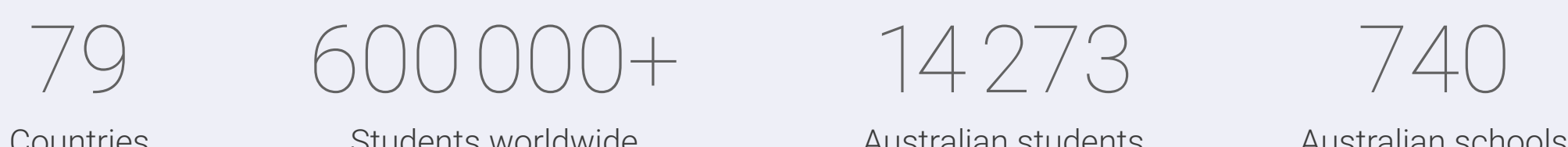


A snapshot of Australian student and school characteristics measured by the 2018 Programme for International Student Assessment

## What is PISA?

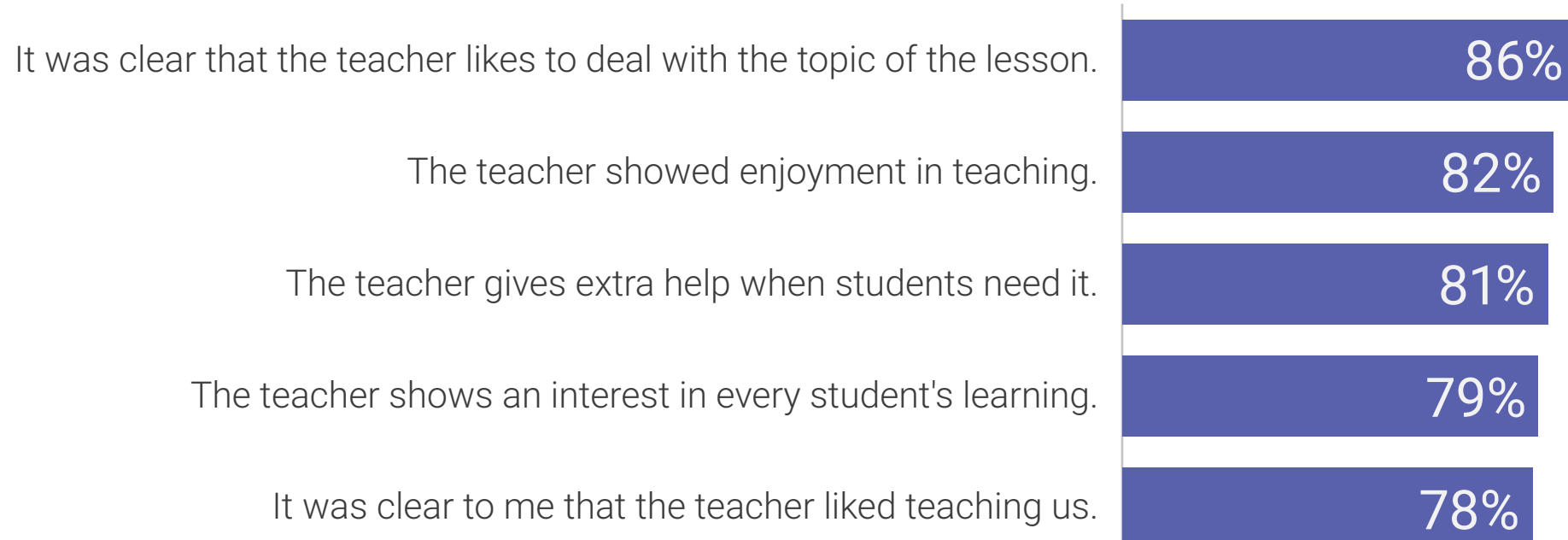
PISA measures 15-year-olds' reading, mathematical and scientific literacy achievement, and also looks at student background, attitudes and school factors, and how these are related to student performance.

## PISA 2018 participants



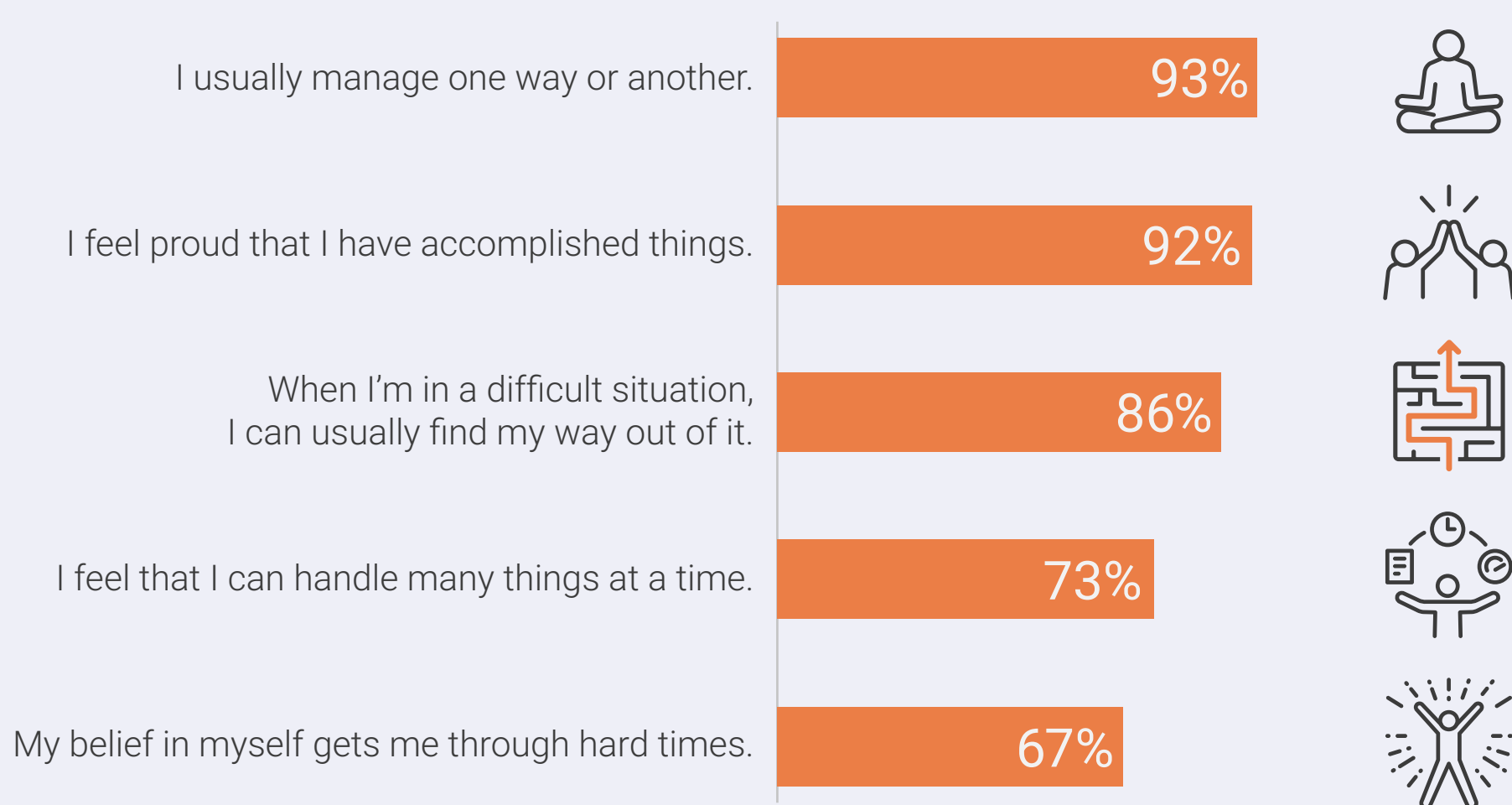
## Teachers

Australian students reported a high level of support from their teachers, similar to students in New Zealand, Singapore and Finland, and at a level above the OECD average.

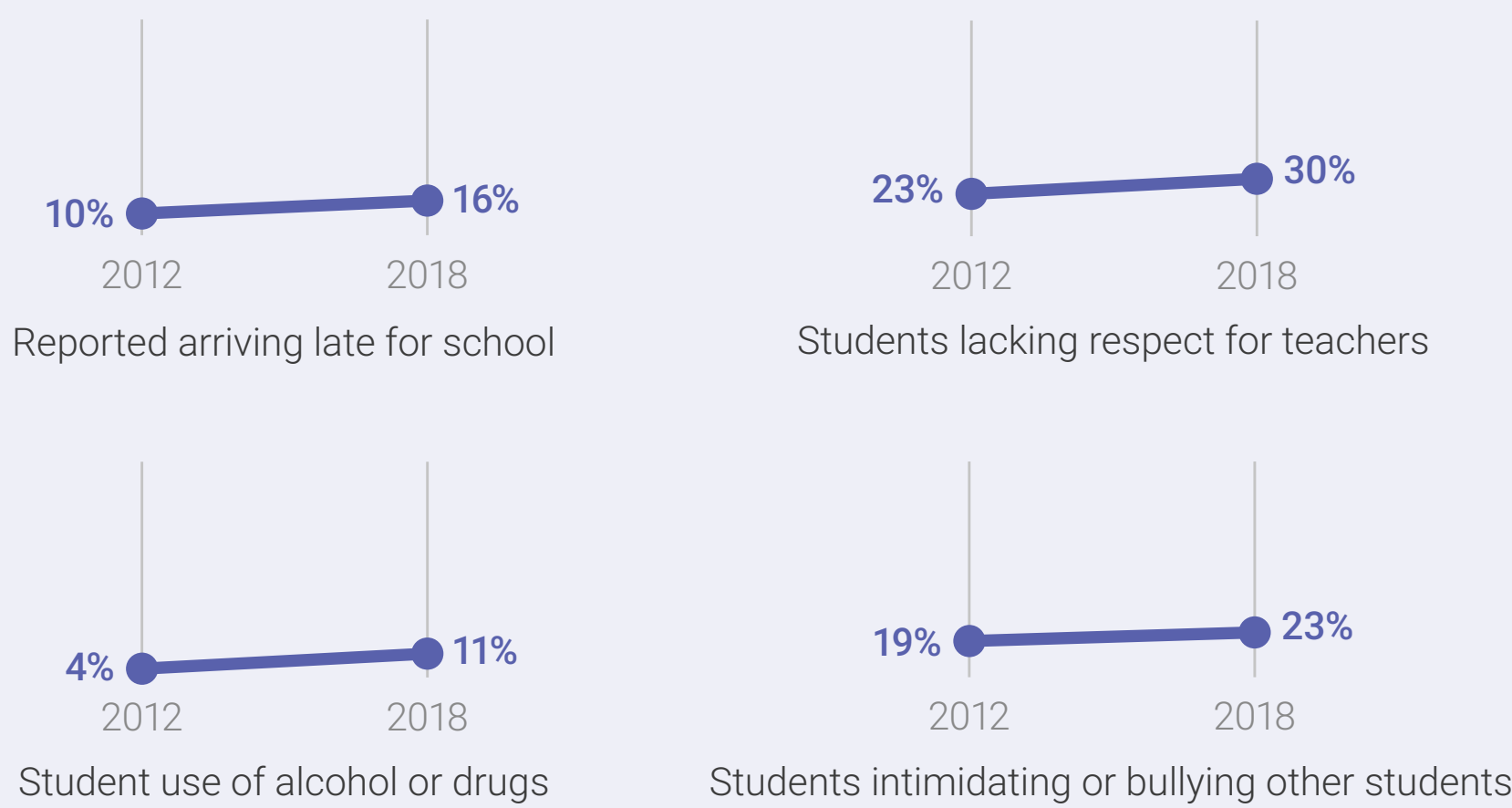

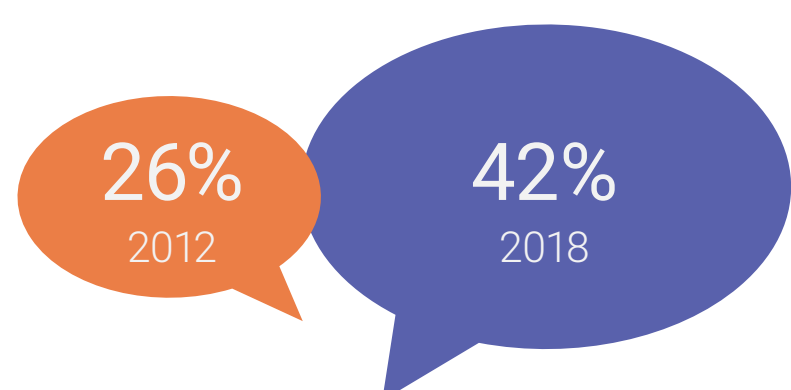
Belief in their own ability (self-efficacy)



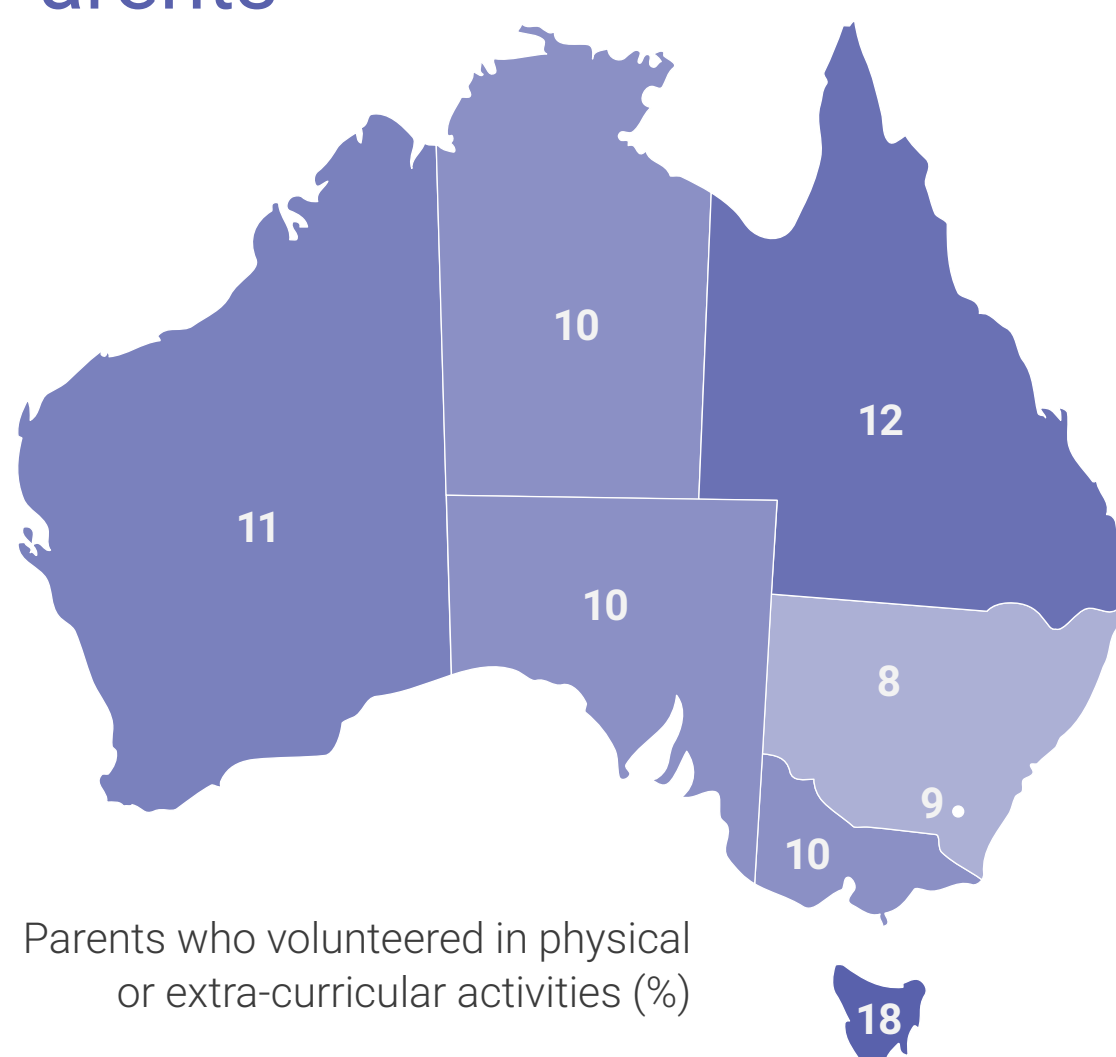
### Student lateness and behaviour hindering learning increased
