The ACER Applied Reading Test Second Edition (ART-2) is a quick and easily administered test of adult literacy. It is suitable for recruitment selection into administrative, trades or operational positions; assessing the literacy of adults with a non-English speaking background; and testing for entry into TAFE or further education courses. ART-2 can also be used to assess the reading comprehension of those returning to work or study after rehabilitation or long-term unemployment, as well as of those with disabilities or medical conditions.

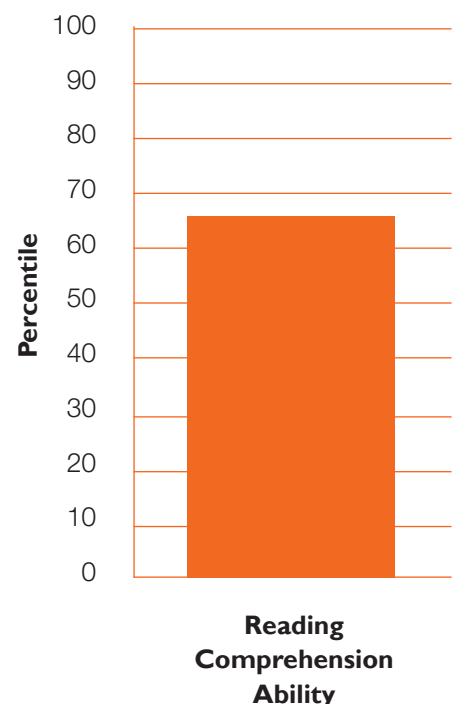
The test contains information commonly found in the workplace and is presented in a variety of formats. ART-2 is free of technical jargon or text that depends on previous training or knowledge.

This ensures its relevance in various workplace contexts, as well as its validity in assessing a candidate's ability to interpret written material presented in various formats, regardless of their background.

The Basic Literacy test is targeted towards those who may have had little formal education or who come from a non-English speaking background. It is suitable for those seeking employment in operational roles. It contains simple signs, information, diagrams and text typically found in a work environment such as a warehouse, factory or assembly plant.
