1. Purpose

To ensure that Staff Members and Students of ACER Higher Education Courses and Units demonstrate integrity and honesty in their study, teaching, research and dealings with each other and those with whom they come in contact.

5. Policy Principles

The prime objective of this policy is to ensure that all those who work and study at ACER in the Courses and Units offered by the ACER Institute act with honesty and integrity in their academic endeavours and when dealing with each other and members of ACER's broader community.

6. Roles and Responsibilities

- 6.1 The ACER Institute is responsible for:
 - i. developing clear academic integrity statements, policies and procedures that are consistently implemented;
 - ii. informing and educating ACER's academic community regarding academic integrity policies and procedures;
 - iii. developing a clear, accessible and equitable system to adjudicate suspected violations of this policy;
 - iv. regularly assessing the effectiveness of its policies and procedures and taking steps to improve and rejuvenate them
- 6.2 Staff Members are responsible for:
 - i. regularly reminding Students of the values embedded in academic integrity and honesty;
 - ii. keeping up-to-date with their academic reading and participating in disciplinerelated conferences, seminars and workshops so that their teaching and scholarship remain informed and reflect contemporary research results and findings without bias or value judgment;
 - iii. presenting intellectual and practical issues in a balanced and open way so that they encourage, enhance and inspire Student learning;
 - iv. creating a learning environment of free intellectual enquiry where Students can explore their ideas and express their views free from the fear of ridicule or criticism.
 - 6.3 Students are expected to:
 - i. develop an ability to objectively assess their opinions and the opinions of others free of bias or value judgements;
 - ii. respect the views of others;
 - iii. acknowledge that their behaviour in the classroom, and online, has the capacity to positively or negatively affect the learning opportunities of others;
 - iv. act honestly in all dealings with others even though the consequences may seem inopportune at the time.

7. Dispute Resolution

Should a dispute arise in relation to the interpretation or application of this policy or its procedures a Grievance may be notified and managed in accordance with the ACER PP3111 Student Grievance Resolution Policy.

8. Awareness of Policy
